(g) Senator Donovan reported on numerous bills taken to the General Session and stated that 10% of the bills affected Fairfax County. Specifically: the appropriations bill which overshedowed all others; Implementation of the functions of the Sanitary District so that the Board of Supervisors would have control over these matters. Senator Donovan proposed a bill relative to Federally donated capital, but the bill didn't get out of the Rules Committee. Bill to enable Federal employees to hold office in the local County Government which wasn't passed. House of Representatives made a determined effort to pass a bill that would effect the distribution of State funds but the bill wasn't passed. Since the Rules Committee was hand picked it was extremely difficult to get these bills on the floor for discussion.
