Subj: Dedicated Fark Areas

In order to fully understand the question involved a short definition of the term dedication is necessary; Dedication is the act of devoting or giving property for some proper object and in such manner as to conclude the owner. but, the vital principle of dedication being the intention to dedicate, such acts and declarations must be deliberate, unequivocal and decided, manifesting a positive and unmistakable intention to permanently abondon his property to such use. The intention to dedicate, however expressed, is the soul of every dedication and wherever this intention unequivocally appears, the dedication is complete on the part of the dedicator.

Dedication may be shown by all kinds of evidence. There are two classes of dedications, expressed and implied. The intent to dedicate is essential to both classes in order to complete a dedication.

The character of the acts done by the public, knowledge or lack of knowledge on the part of the owner, and of their character, and the intentions indicated by them, all bear upon the question of the intention to dedicate. No obstruction of the subject of dedication or encroachment upon it by the original owner of the soil or by anyone holding under or through him will impair the right of the public to its

benefits unless the land so dedicated has been abondoned by the public or by the proper authority. And dedication is completed when the owner has unequivocable manifested his intent to dedicate and there has been an acceptance by competent authority.

WHAT MAY BE DONE WITH DEDICATED LAND - By accepting the dedicated land the public is bound to use the land for the purposes was for which it/dedicated and no other. And any lot owner having the right to the use of the land dedicated may make such changes as are necessary for the reasonable enjoyment of the easement possessed by him, so long as he does not materially affect any other abuting owner's reasonably convenient use of such dedicated land. And when land is dedicated by a plat, the rights of the lot owner are not to wait in abeyance until the public authorities see fit to accept and take charge of such dedicated land, but he is at once entitled to have all such dedicated land opened for his use, necessary to the enjoyment of his property.

IN CONCLUSION - It is my firm opinion that the sites in question have been dedicated as parks.
