

- Appropriate forms of citizen involvement in the franchising process of the cable system;

Greenway Downs Citizens Association Executive Committee Meeting Mike Arm's House October 7, 1981

The meeting began at 8:05 p.m. Guests present were representatives from the County Dept. of Public Works, Joe Sunday and Elle Hockman; from the County Neighborhood Improvement Program, Patti Rounsevell, and from Jim Scott's office, Peter Intermaggio. Joe Sunday and Elle Hockman explained how the Greenway Blvd. construction project stood at the present time and what steps still needed to be taken before construction could begin. We were reassured as to the availability of funds to complete the project through Phase II (designwork and construction on Woodlawn, George Mason and Cameron). Funding for Phase III (designwork and construction on other streets such as Winchester Way) is uncertain. Here, improvements may have to be paid for out of general funds or a fiscal 1984 or '85 bond issue.

We were told that sixteen easements are needed from residents before construction can begin on Greenway. As easement gives permission for a contractor to come onto the property, do what needs to be done and restore the property to its original condition. Easements are attached to the property and are not affected by a change of owner. Among the easements needed are storm drainage, temporary grading, right of way and permanent storm drainage. Six months is an optimistic time frame for obtaining these easements. The County currently has Mr. Jim Ashton of the Land Acquisition Agency at work full-time trying to obtain needed easements. A resident reluctant to sign can hold up construction single-handed. When the County has the easements in hand, residents will receive notices. The project then goes to the bidding stage which lasts thirty days. The County advertises in three local papers. Contracting is monitored by the County. A needed permit is now being obtained from the Virginia Dept. of Highways. Patti Rounsevell announced that a meeting with residents of Phase II streets (Woodlawn, Cameron and George Mason) would be necessary soon. Phase II designwork should start soon and a contract for this will be awarded at the end of the month to the engineering firm of Patton. Harris. Rust and Guy.

Henry Rodriguez asked about promised park improvements which have not materialized. A parking barrier was approved at a public hearing and a bridge, trails, grading, general clean-up and a tot lot in Squirrel Woods were approved at another public hearing on a separate occasion. Peter Intermaggio of Jim Scott's office will take this up with Louis Cable of the Park Authority and find out for us.

The Japanese-style bridge at Monroe Street and Custis Parkway has disappeared. It was not in good condition.

Mr. Intermaggio went on to speak about the redistricting of Providence. In the east, Providence will lose to the Mason district and will grow toward McLean and Oakton. They hope to retain as many older neighborhoods as possible. He spoke further about the bond issues appearing on the November ballot, the school bond, the road bond and the detention center bond. In particular he mentioned the importance of passing the road bond as Richmond has finally allowed Fairfax County to take care of some of its own road problems. Local road problems were briefly discussed. He promised that Association officers would get on Jim Scott's newsletter mailing list.

Zoning violations were discussed such as rusting vehicles and separate rented apartments in a one-family home. Renting a room is not a zoning violation. Chances of having a complaint enforced against a rental apartment are almost nil. Enforcement depends on the inspector's persuasive powers. The County is trying to change the law so that it has more control over these situations. If you have a complaint, the zoning inspector is Natalie Bæcker (621-2215). The treasurer made his report and it was approved. We have \$876.66 on hand.


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

Following a street meeting with County officials concerning curbs, gutters and storm sewers on Cameron, George Mason and Woodlawn, President Mike Arm called the executive committee meeting to order.

Elle Hockman of the County Dept. of Public Works told us that construction on Greenway Blvd. offered an opportunity for the County to introduce new street lights, orange ones, to our neighborhood. Street lights will be the first thing affected by the construction. This particular type of light uses a 5000 sodium bulb which is cheaper to operate and burns with an orange light. Its use would result in savings for the County. Presently street lights use a 3300 mercury vapor bulb which gives a cool fluorescent light; however just lately a brighter bulb, a 7000 mercury vapor has been introduced so you may have noticed that your street seemed brighter. The 7000 mercury vapor is cheaper to operate as well as being brighter. As to the proposed orange lights, the County needs one decision for the whole community by January or February. As street improvements go in, so will the new lights if we approve them. Even streets not scheduled for improvements may eventually receive the new orange lights. New communities automatically get the orange lights.

There followed discussion. Some residents questioned whether more brightness was a desirable thing and were not happy with the current brighter bulb. Comments about orange street lights were not entirely favorable. One suggestion was for the County to consider Metal Allied lights.

Elle Hockman will give us the names of some residential neighborhoods where the orange 5000 sodium lights are now in use so we can visit them and judge for ourselves. Information will be published in the Downs. A general meeting may be held. A decision will be needed by January or February.

Elling Reich motioned that we pay the federation dues of \$40. Mary Millsback seconded. After some discussion, the motion carried.

The next item of business was the Directory. Pat Mastroleo is donating the use of his electric typewriter but he feels the Association should pay for carbon film. There was debate about how many copies of the Directory should be printed and the cost. This issue was not resolved.

The meeting adjourned at 10 p.m. as it was time for the building to be shut down for the night.
