Our guest speaker in January was Patti Rounsevell, the County's Improvement Program Chief. She was extremely informative and helpful regarding the areas with which she is charged. Understandably, she was not able to answer all

She did tell us that, if we so requested, her office could arrange for an engineer to meet with us, at County expense to conduct a survey of the needs and desires of residents on individual streets.
