Fortune Restaurant (Seven Corners Shopping Center next to Home Depot)



I usually compare Chinese restaurants by tasting their egg drop soup, and Fortune's was delicious! The shrimp toast, however, left something to be desired. For entrees, we shared the tofu casserole and sautéed spinach with tofu sauce – both of which were exceptional. The service and decor were excellent as well. If you haven't tried it, try it!

Mark's Duck House

(6184-A Arlington Boulevard)



We've eaten here often and have never been disappointed by this restaurant that offers authentic Hong Kong dim sum. The only drawback is that the Duck House is always crowded and noisy – take the family for a great meal, but don't take a date for a romantic interlude! Go, but get there early to avoid standing in line waiting for a table!

Majestic Crab House

(2922 Annandale Road)



We started with spring rolls, which were the only thing I didn't like. We followed with peanut chicken, lotus root and pork salad, and crabs, the house specialty. We dined on huge portions as the owner/waiter shared his experiences about his escape from Viet Nam. He talked about the

pirates who twice boarded his boat. The food and his warmth made the Majestic a marvelous dining experience. If you like crabs, a homey atmosphere, and good food, try the Crab House.

Old Hickory Grill

(7263-6 Arlington Boulevard in Loehman's Plaza)



We shared mammoth portions of ribs, charred too much for my taste, and shrimp. I also had the most fantastic red-skin mashed potatoes I've ever eaten. The food is Cajun and hot, which may send your taste buds into a frenzy, so be prepared! The service, however, was among the best I've seen on five continents. The Grill's charming wait staff anticipated our every need without us having to ask for anything. If you like good service, give the Grill a try.

Pho Huyen

(133 East Annandale Road)



This small, newly opened restaurant serves a dozen varieties of freshly made Vietnamese soups and entrees. I had the Bun Cha Gio, a minced noodle dish, served with an egg roll. Bun Cha Gio is served at room temperature, which made for a different taste sensation – not to my liking. The service was fast and the prices were low, but the over-all food quality doesn't begin to approach that of the nearby Galaxy Restaurant!
