SEX EDUCATION

On November 6, the Fairfax County School Board received an information briefing on a proposed Sex Education Program of Studies, Levels 5-6, 7-8, The Board will act on this proposal December 18, 1975. There will be a Program of Studies and the instructional materials display for review and evaluation by interested citizens through December 18 at the Fairfax County Public School Area II Office. (Key Intermediate School) 6402 Franconia Road, Springfield. Individuals desirng to review the Program and Instructional materials should present themselves to the Area II Office receptionist and ask to see the Sex Education Display. It will be available for viewing from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday until the close of business on December 18. Films may be viewed on an appointment basis by calling Mrs. Harris at 971-8200. Each reviewer of the display will be asked to comment on forms provided in order to assist the School Board in making a decision.

Sex Education is contemplated as part of a comprehensive health education program with general social, emotional, physical, and personal growth and development study. It would be offered to students at the 5th-6th, 7th-8th, 9th-12th grade levels. Prior to student instruction on this program, parents will have been given an opportunity to review sex related program materials and will have signed a permission slip for such instruction. Those students whose parents do not elect to have them receive this instruction, shall be given a health education program that does not include human sex education. Instructional groupings will be separated by sex. Each teacher selected to teach sex education units shall receive inservice training for this program. Inservice training will begin immediately after community review, and local and state approval. The new program will start in September.

FALLS CHURCH HIGH SCHOOL NEWS

The Band

Greenway Downs wishes to congratulate the members of the Falls Church High School Band in winning a silver placque at the Philadelphia Parade of Champions at Convention Hall in Philadelphia on November 1. Falls Church was one of two bands which was rated outstanding in the four categories for which they were judged: music, marching and maneuvering, general effects and inspection.

Newcomers to this area, or even parents of non-band members, may not be aware that Fairfax County Schools sport some of the most outstanding high school bands in the country. It is gratifying to know that our local Falls Church Jaguar Band has for the past decade consistently received top placements in band competitions across the eastern half of the United States and standing ovations at a number of college and professional football games. Almost more impressive are the high school records which indicate that no student enrolled in the band program at Falls Church High has dropped out of school since 1962.

The Falls Church High Band will represent the State of Virginia at the St. Petersburg, Florida "Bicentennial Festival of the States" April 6 through 10, 1976, and will perform at Disney World on April 8.

Bands striving for competitive excellence must maintain a well balanced program: parade marching, field marching, concert, symphonic and sightreading presentation. Falls Church has 165 marching band members performing in what midwesterners call "Big Ten" style with band members playing while being in almost constant motion. Songs are marches, show tunes and popular music, family entertainment that can't be beaten. THE DOWNS will continue to post FCHS Band activities.
