HEALTH FAIR

Final preparations are now being made for the Greenway Downs Community Health Fair on Saturday, November 22, from 10:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. at Devonshire School. This is your last chance to sign up for an appointment at a time convenient to you. Otherwise, you will be asked to wait in line on a first come basis.

The tests provided by the Health Fair include height and weight, blood pressure, anemia, complete blood analysis, cholesterol, vision and hearing. Also tentatively scheduled will be a lung test and glaucoma test. All the tests are free except for the complete blood analysis which costs \$3.25. This charge covers the laboratory fee.

Participants for the Health Fair are asked to avoid heavy fatty foods and foods with sugar for a few hours prior to testing to avoid inaccurate results. In addition, each participant must provide two stamped envelopes with one addressed to himself and the other addressed to his physician. Finally, the association will ask for a voluntary contribution of 50ϕ to cover the cost of using the school on a weekend.

Volunteers are still needed to devote about 3-1/2 hours of their time to assist in registration, testing, compiling test results and child care. We are hoping to get enough volunteers to
