Now is the time to clean out your garage, attic, and basement and hold a "hassle free" yard sale. We will put ads in the Journal and the Post and put up street signs to get the customers to you. All you have to do is gather up your "trash and treasures" and put them out for sale. If you have never had a yard sale before, you will be amazed at the people that will pay good money for those "white elephants" that have been collecting dust in your basement for years. We suggest that you price all items ahead of time, made sure you have plenty of change, and wear comfortable shoes!!!! In addition to making some money and getting rid of your unuseables, you will also have alot of fun.

WHERE TO SELL YOUR ITEMS

With this yard sale you have your choice of selling in your yard or bringing all your "trash and treasures" down to the basketball court and setting up shop there. There are obvious reasons for each. In your own yard it will be much easier; at the basketball court, however, you may have more customers. In either case, you'll be responsible for supplying the table on which to display your wares and for selling and collecting the money for your own things. If you wish to sell on the basketball court, please fill out the form and return it by March 31st with your check for \$5.00. There is a limited amount of space, so reserve your spot early. Each space will be approximately 12 feet (2 picnic tables) wide. If you decide to sell in your own yard, no need to let us know, just have your items ready for sale early on Saturday morning, April 5th. The crowds will start arriving early, despite our advertised 9 a.m. opening. If you are holding your sale in your garage or back yard, be sure to have a sign by the sidewalk pointing the way so you don't miss any potential customers!!!! To help us advertise this yard sale, use the back of this page as an original to make Xerox copies that you can post on bulletins boards at work, grocery stores, school, church, or other appropriate locations.

Remember what you can't sell can still be donated to a worthwhile cause like Goodwill, Salvation Army or a local thrift shop. Donations of books can be made to a local library or nursing home. We attempted to get a community pick-up for the leftovers, but all places we contacted said they do not pick-up after yard sales. Therefore, it will be each household's responsibilty to call for pick-up on their own.

SUGGESTIONS FOR A SUCCESSFUL YARD SALE

- Be prepared.
- 2. Price all items ahead of time.
- 3. Have lots of change (especially quarters and dollar bills).
- 4. Place items within easy reach of buyers (keep as much as possible off the ground).
- 5. Hang clothes on hangers if possible and put size as well as price on each garment.
- 6. Be ready early in the morning as people always come early to try and get the best bargins; we advertised opening at 9 a.m.
- 7. Wear a badge or a silly hat; something to identify yourself as the buyer.
- 8. Have an electric outlet available to test any appliances you may wish to sell. (Outlet not available at basketball court)
- 9. Cut your prices in the afternoon on all items you really want to sell.
- 10. As you're getting ready for your sale, start a "FREE" box for items not worth selling.
- 11. Have a supply of paper bags for your customers to haul away your stuff.
- 12. Don't be shy; suggest possible uses for items; offer to hold babies so mothers can shop liesurely.
- 13. Be willing to "deal!" Remember the main point is to get rid of your stuff.
