  - (c) Swift payments or any other credits to acct. in bank in June and to date in July.
  - (d) Enclose checkbook on Falls Church Bank.

22—Colorado Springs, Colo.  
24—Denver, Colorado

I am notifying Life Insurance Companies to send notices to you, or in your case, until further notice. Everything is taken care of for the present. Next premiums will be due in Sept., but need not be paid until 4<sup>th</sup> of Oct. Will write you on that later.

Because of a very stupid blunder on the part of s shipping clerk our Kamper Kar was sent to Washington, D.C. and we have had to wait for another to be shipped here from factory in Michigan. My directions were very explicit, and their apologies profuse, but it has held us up longer than we anticipated. However, we have spent most of our time very pleasantly with friends near here- and still have abundance of time to make our trip. Probably leave here Sat., July 12.
